## Lights Before Christmas kicks off Nov. 18 at The Toledo Zoo

## Welcome “Christmas Tree Ship”

The National Museum of the Great Lakes will welcome the arrival of the Christmas Tree Ship Saturday, Dec. 3 from 1-4 p.m.

Area residents are invited to purchase a Christmas tree for themselves or a family in need and then watch Santa arrive with the trees at the event, held in partnership with Geo. Gradel Co.

“On Nov. 23, 1912, the schooner Rouse Simmons sank while carrying Christmas trees,” said Ellen Kennedy, the museum’s Director of Education and Visitor Experience. “Known as the Christmas Tree Ship, her captain, lovingly referred to as ‘Captain Santa,’ was remembered for giving trees to families in need.”

Inspired by the original Christmas Tree Ship tale, participants can pre-purchase a live Christmas tree for themselves and/or donate a tree or gift card to a family in need. The museum has partnered with United Way of Greater Toledo and 2-1-1 and are working with East Toledo Family Center, Family House, Lucas County Children’s Services, and Sylvania Area

Family Services to distribute trees and holiday support to families in need.

This year, in collaboration with the East Toledo community, the museum will host the event in the afternoon to encourage visitors to participate in the neighboring East Toledo Holiday Parade, which will begin at 11 a.m. and travel along East Broadway and Starr Avenue.

The Christmas Tree Ship arrival is free outdoor event, open to the general public. In addition, admission to the museum exhibits will be free for all who purchase or donate tree or donate toward a gift card.

# Holiday Light Show opening at Lucas County Fairgrounds

The Lucas County Holiday Light Show opens Friday, Nov. 18 at the Lucas County Fairgrounds, 1406 Key St., Maumee.

Visitors can enjoy the show, which features a mile of dancing light displays, from the comfort of their vehicles. For added enjoyment, music synchronized to the animated displays is available by tuning into the radio station provided.

Visitors can expect to take 20-25 minutes to drive through the show in its entirety.

The Lucas County Light Show runs on select dates through Dec. 31. Advance tickets are \$25 per carload with a reservation, or \$62.50 for unlimited visits, which require no reservation. Tickets may be purchased at the gate, although availability is not guaranteed.
